KATHMANDU

- Patan Durbar Square is situated at the centre of the city of Lalitpur in Nepal. It is one of the three Durbar Square in the Kathmandu Valley, all of which are UNESCO World Heritage Site. One of its attraction is the ancient royal palace where the Malla King of Lalitpur resided. The Durbar Square is a marvel of Newar architecture.
- Krishna Temple The most spectacular temple is the Krishna Mandir ('mandir' in Nepali means 'temple'). There are two Krishna Mandirs in the Durbar Square, both carved out of stone and the one known as Chyasim Deval is the unceremonious one, while all religious rites and festivities take place in the more popular Krishna Mandir that lies opposite the Patan Museum. King Siddhinarasimha Malla built this temple in 1636 AD. King Yoganarendra Malla's daughter, Yogamati, built the other Krishna Mandir or Chyasim Deval in Patan in 1723 AD.
- Bhaktapur Durbar Square is located in the current town of Bhaktapur, also known as Bhadgaon, which lies 13km east of Kathmandu. While the complex consists of at lease four distinct squares (Durbar Square, Taumadhi Square, Dattatreya Square and Pottery Square), the whole area is informally known as the Bhaktapur Durbar Square and is a highly visited site in the Kathmandu Valley. It is a UNESCO World Heritage Site.
- 55 Window Palace The Palace of Fifty-five Windows (Pachpanna Jhyale Durbar) was built during the reign of the Malla King Bhupatindra Malla who ruled from 1696 to 1722 AD and was not complete until 1754 AD during the reign of his son Ranjit Malla.
- Boudhanath The biggest and oldest stupa in Nepal. The stupa, a well known Buddhist pilgrimage site, is included in World Heritage Cultural site list by UNESCO. With diameter of about 100m and 40m height.
- **Kathmandu Durbar Square** Durbar Square is the spiritual heart of Kathmandu. Around central Durbar Square, there is the Royal Palace, palaces, pagodas, courtyards, temples and the Kumari House, the residence of the Living Goddess. The old royal palace is situated at the centre of the city and was surrounded by the temples and other important building. Many of the old buildings were re-built after the 1934 earthquake.
- Kasthamandap The Kasthamandap (Wooden temple) is situated in the south west corner and one of the most famous building of Kathmandu. It is built in 1596 by Raja Lachmina Singh from the wood of one enormous sal tree. It was originally a rest house or community centre and later converted into a temple dedicated to Gorakhnath, whose shrine sits in the centre of a small enclosure. There temples were built between the 21th and 18th centuries by the Malla kings.

Swayambhunath Stupa – is an ancient religious architecture atop a hill in the Kathmandu Valley, west of Kathmandu city. The stupa has Buddha's eyes and eyebrows painted on. Between them, the number one (in Devanagari script) is painted in the fashion of a nose. The stupa has stood as a hallmark of faith and harmony for centuries with Hindu temples and deities incorporated in this Buddhist site.

CHITWAN NATIONAL PARK

- Chitwan National Park is the first national park in Nepal. It was established in 1973 and granted the status of a World Heritage Site in 1984. It covers an area of 932 km2 and is located in the subtropical Inner Terai lowlands of south-central Nepal in the districts of Nawalparasi, Parsa, Chitwan and Makwanpur. Chitwan National Park is home of One Horn Rhino, Royal Bengal Tiger, Sloth Bear, Leopard along with different reptiles and different species of birds. It is one of the largest playgrounds of wild animals in Nepal.
- Manakamana Temple situated in the Gorkha District of Nepal is the sacred place of the Hindu Goddess Bhagwati, an incarnation of Parvati. The name Manakamana originates from two words, "mana" meaning heart and "kamana" meaning wish. Venerated since the 17th century, it is believed that Goddess Manakamana grants the wishes of all those who make the pilgrimage to her shrine to worship her.

POKHARA

- Phewa Lake One of Nepal's most beautiful sport, Phewa Tal is surrounded by a combination of monkey-filled forest and the high white peaks. The reflection in the mirror-like water in the early mornings are something you must see at least once.
- Davis Fall In nepali meaning underworld falls is a waterfall located at Pokhara in Kaski District, Nepal. An interesting aspect of the falls is that the water travels through a natural tunnel prior.
